What is a Medication Review?

- A medication review is a chance for you to talk with your doctor or pharmacist about your medicines
- The goal is to review each medicine you are taking, what it is for, and how you should be taking it
- You should bring in ALL your medicines to your appointment to make sure nothing is missed
- The process can help identify potential problems with your medicines and allow those issues to be fixed
- · Medication reviews also allow you to ask questions about your medicines

What to Expect

- Plan for the review to take 10-20 minutes. However, it may take longer if you take a lot of medicines or have a lot of questions about your medicines
- The doctor or pharmacist will ask you questions about how you get your medicines and how you take them, and may make changes if needed
- All information you share will remain confidential

What to Bring With You

1 All the medicines you are taking, including:

- Prescription medicines
- ✓ Over-the-counter medicines
- Supplements and vitamins
- Ointments, creams, and patches
- Eye drops and ear drops
- ✓ Injectables (if feasible to bring)

2 A complete, printed list of all your medicines, including:

- ✓ Name of each medicine
- ✓ Why you take it
- ✓ How much you take (dose)
- ✓ How often you take it

A written list of any questions you have about your medicines

A complete list of all your doctors with their contact information
